R. & B. 3/2024 - Maplewood Road Traffic Calming By-law Amendment
 - Motion Required

Director of Public Works, Chris Cook noted that he and Councillor Hergott met with residents of Paradise Lake on February 12, 2024. Director Cook stated that his recommendation is to designate this location as a Community Safety Zone and install additional speed signage.

Councillor Wagner asked if staff could install a speed camera in the area.

Director Cook responded that municipalities are not currently permitted to place automated speed cameras in Community Safety Zones.

Councillor Wagner asked if there will be increased police enforcement.

Director Cook responded that he has requested that the Waterloo Regional Police include this location in the STEP program.

Mayor Nowak asked how long staff will wait before determining if the Community Safety Zone is working?

Director Cook responded that staff will complete another study at the same time of year as the first study. The first study was completed during the summer months for a period of 24 hours per day for 3 days.

Councillor Hergott asked why the recommendation did not include a speed reduction?

Director Cook stated that he did not feel it was necessary to reduce the speeds based on the study that was completed.

2. R. &. B. 4/2024 - Queen's Bush Road Reconstruction (Phase 2) Tender Award - Contract #2024-02 - Motion Required

Director of Public Works, Chris Cook stated that the first phase of the Queens Bush Road reconstruction was successfully completed last year. It is staffs recommendation is to award the contract for phase two and three to be completed in 2024.

Mayor Nowak asked when residents would be notified.

Director Cook responded that that the project is anticipated to begin during the third week of May and notice to residents will be a month in advance.

Mayor Nowak asked if residents will have access to their driveways during the project?

Director Cook stated that driveways will be accessible and 24 hour notice will be given by the contractor if that changes.

Mayor Nowak asked for more information regarding the parking area on the North side of the road.

Director Cook responded that a 5 foot asphalt parking strip will be included in phase two along the North side of the road. Director Cook noted that with the curbs installed during reconstruction roadside parking has been eliminated and the parking strip will allow cars to be parked along the roadside without interfering with traffic.

Councillor Brick asked if the construction will be complete before school is in?

Director Cook responded that there is no way the work can be completed without effecting one school year. Director Cook stated that the construction will be completed before the Apple Butter and Cheese Festival.

Councillor Brick asked if there are concerns applying top coat before the base road has gone through a winter?

Director Cook stated that there will be time for the ground to settle before the top coat is applied.
