The theme of the Festival was **Water Does Wonders**.





Today, Sept. 15, Metroland Media announced it will be
restructuring its operations and seeking protection under the
Bankruptcy and Insolvency Act.

As part of this plan, most of Metroland's 71 community newspapers will move to a digital-only model. The final delivery of your local paper was this week. Metroland's six daily publications will continue to publish both online and in print. We are confident this restructuring will make Metroland a sustainable business moving forward.

ardous waste is generated in Ontario each year. If Ontario continues on its current trajectory of waste generation and disposal, existing landfill sites in the province will be filled within the next 9–12 years.

Approximately 40% of Ontario's waste is generated inside the home. The balance is generated outside the home, by almost 1.6 million businesses, corporations and institutions. The Nith Valley EcoBoosters are hosting a free webinar, Mission Possible: Launch Your Waste Reduction Journey! on Thursday, September 28 from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. EDT. Participants will learn about specific steps that can be taken to reduce waste in their lives and also what corporations and governments need to do to reduce waste.

Our keynote speaker is Jamie Kaminski. With more than 30 years in the waste diversion industry, Jamie is a seasoned international speaker with broad knowledge of local and global zero-waste policies. He has spoken at zero-waste and waste-related conferences, and to companies in the private and public sectors. As the codeveloper of the first globally accessible zero-waste education program, he has trained and mentored over 100 individuals and industry professionals. Besides his role as President of HSR Services and HSR Zero Waste, Jamie is the Director and Lead Policy Advisor for Zero Waste Canada and a Board Member of the Zero Waste International Alliance (ZWIA) policy group. His media appearances include interviews on CBC News-The National, Global BC, CTV News Vancouver, and CBC Radio-Canada, Jamie's presentation will include a discussion of what governments and corporations need to do to manage the waste problem followed by specific actions that individuals can take to reduce waste in their lives.

Following Jamie's presentation, a panel consisting of members of the community will share their personal experiences trying to reduce waste. A Question & Answer period will follow the presentations.

EcoNugget

Garlic Mustard was brought to North America as an edible herb but has become a serious forest invader.

- Garlic mustard forms dense stands, even in shade, and interferes with the seed germination of native woodland species such as drooping trillium and wood poppy.
- Identification is helped by the distinctive garlic smell when the leaves are crushed.
- Garlic mustard seeds remain viable in the ground for many years, so it is worth the effort to remove plants before they go to seed. In our area, mid-May to early June is good timing, but removing plants is important at all times.
- Garlic mustard is readily pulled by hand, but take care to dispose of the plants with care so seeds do not spread. If necessary, concentrate on the second-year (seed producing) plants.


